TREASURER: New CD – Treasurer Brenda Wallace stated that new guidelines at Farmers & Merchants Bank now requires two signatures from the Board to open a new CD. Wallace stated that interest is at 0.7% more than the other two banks. Moved by Twombly and seconded by Wedemeyer for the chair to sign the Farmers & Merchants Bank CD to allow Treasurer Wallace to open a CD. **Resolution Naming Depositories** – Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Twombly to approve **Resolution #2024-48** – Resolution Naming Depositories. Roll call: Walker, aye; Baier, aye; Hoadley, aye; and Twombly, aye. Approved. Nick Kauffman entered and Wallace exited at 9:06 a.m.

ICAP INSURANCE CHANGES: Jayne Lents, Don Carlos Insurance Agency, gave an update to the Board on some policy changes for the County's lowa Communities Assurance Pool property insurance. Lents explained that with the FY25 insurance renewal the wind and hail deductible went from \$1,000 to 2% of the value of the building/asset that is insured. Lents also explained that cosmetic damages such as dings or pits are no longer to going to be covered and any roof over 15 years old, they will take depreciation off of. Other insurance companies, like EMC that many other government entities use, are also doing the same changes. Supervisor Wedemeyer stated that the Board will need to think about setting aside a certain dollar amount during budgeting that may help us with these situations in the future. Lents hopes that the County never has to use it, but wanted the Board and Department Heads aware of the change. Kent entered at 9:08 a.m. Lents exited at 9:13 a.m.

CROSSROADS BEHAVIORAL HEALTH – OPIOID PROGRAM: Jess Petter, Brittany Palmer, and Kate Jensen, Crossroads, and Talli Ramey, NV School Counselor, gave an update to the Board on the results from the middle school and high school programs that were funded through the Opioid Settlement Funds from the County. The group seen improvements in the kids that participated in the program and thought all students learned something, even those who thought they knew everything about drugs and alcohol. Palmer also stated that this program also helps to catch those needing assistance on the mental health side and they have been able to get those people connected with therapists. These kids are making new friends and building healthier relationships with these friends. Jensen thought the biggest change she had seen were the kids' attitudes towards school and they focused a lot on goal setting. Palmer stated that in addition to what the Board funded last year, they would like to ask for extra funds to send Jensen and Petter to training for a total of \$44,195.26. Auditor Berg stated that we have received most of our payments for this fiscal year and currently

have a fund balance of over \$78,000 with no other plans to use the funds at this time. Moved by Baier and seconded by Hoadley to fund \$45,000 to Crossroads from the opioid settlement funds for the school programming. Approved. Petter, Palmer, Jensen, and Ramey exited at 9:28 a.m.

ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH: Kent. Environmental Health. gave a guarterly report to the Board on Environmental Health. Kent exited at 9:33 a.m.
