**TOWNSHIP CLERK WAGES:** Moved by Twombly and seconded by Baier to approve the township clerk wages for Amanda Pickrell for \$40.00. Approved.

**CHILD ABUSE PREVENTION GRANT DRAW DOWN:** Moved by Wedemeyer and seconded by Twombly for Auditor Berg, as contract administrator, to sign the Child Abuse Prevention Grant Draw Down. Approved.

**AG EXTENSION – RISING STAR INTERN:** Kerry Aistrope, Ag Extension, introduced a program called Rising Start Intern that Iowa State University offers. This is a program that undergraduate students can apply for different positions and a variety of professions ultimately benefitting communities and Counties. This is a position that is created based on the need of the County, which could be anything from conservation, economic development, tourism, or marketing the County. It could also be in conjunction with other entities like the City. There is a short form that the Ag Extension fills out if the Board is interested and the cost would be about \$4,500 which could be a collaboration between the County and Extension. The position would be posted at the University and the extension would perform interviews. Once a candidate is selected, they would fill that position for June and July. Aistrope stated that she was just here to inform the Board about the program and if the Board is interested or has an idea, to let them know. Nick Kauffman entered at 9:04 a.m. Aistrope exited at 9:11 a.m.

ACCESS TO LEWIS AVENUE & 150TH STREET: Rob Mensing stated that he wanted to come back to the Board and clarify a few things on their previous request of gaining access to their land on Lewis Avenue and 150th Street. Mensing hasn't wanted to offend anyone and say that someone isn't, doing their job. Their concern is that the level B road is just not safe for them to use. The previous owner of the property didn't request property and wasn't invested in the County, but now that land is owned by three County residents who live and want to invest in the property. Mensing stated that they are planning on building infrastructure and investing in the land get as much out of if as possible and asked the Board to not underestimated the economic value that brings into the County. Mensing knows that the Board is hesitant about approving this project as others will come and ask for the same treatment, but he thinks the Board needs to question those people and ask about their investment into their County. Mensing would like to see a cost estimate from the County on how much the project would take. Twombly stated he understands their situation but is not for more it a Level A Road and values the opinion of their Engineer. The cost to maintain it alone would be significant. Kauffman stated that the cost of maintenance is just dependent on the weather. With current projects already planned for, Kauffman stated that they can put a culvert in at the low water crossing in two to three years with a cost of \$200-250,000. Kauffman stated that they haven't upgraded roads to a level A much but the cost would include drainage, grading, and maintenance. Moved by Twombly to put in the culvert at the low water crossing and that the rock be provided by owners. Supervisor Wedemeyer stated that he hasn't heard any complaints up until now. Mensing stated that they have tried resolve the problems on their own and that coming to the County is a last resort. Twombly thinks the ongoing cost on maintenance would be high and is not in favor of a level A road. Mensing stated that he has no figures to make a decision and feels like they need facts in order to do so. Wedemeyer stated that he isn't sure they should push back other projects in order to get this on our list and that that would impact more people. Mensing stated he would be ok with a two stage process if that is what would make it easier. The Board and Mensing continued to discuss options and costs that would need considered to get it up to a level A road. The Board stated that there are processes in place and that they have to follow certain rules for any project. Twombly stated that they haven't turned any road into a level A in the sixteen years he has been here. Kauffman stated we have done work with reclaimed rock with the wind turbines, but that was it. Mensing discussed the level A road done in 2016 and it was discussed that that was already a level A road, but it hadn't been rocked and maintained. Baier stated that he didn't like the idea of spending that much on a culvert. Kauffman thinks it is reasonable to replace the low water crossing and if we can get you to that corner, that's reasonable. That gets them from the west intersection to the east intersection and they can do some work on their end to put in a driver. Mensing stated he appreciates the discussion and ideas and that he would need to think about if that is an option for them. Twombly stated that the County is limited on the source of the funding and that TIF funds will not be able to be used - it will have to be LOST or other funds. Walker stated that we can keep working on it and come up with a solution. Unfortunately working with government, everything is going to be higher than it should be. Hardisty exited at 9:42. Jeff Vandewater entered at 9:55 a.m.

**ENGINEER: Maintenance & Activities Report –** Engineer Kauffman gave an update to the Board on the following projects: Henningson broke down so haven't done painting yet, start on shouldering next week, Murphy bridge down, will be back next week to finish painting, grinding up trees at county yards – insurance will pay for it, scrap iron – a lot was there prior to tornado, non FEMA items will be take from Lakeside Auto for \$160/ton. Generator
