COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AGREEMENT: The Board reviewed the proposed comprehensive plan from SICOG. Hoadley stated that she believed it encompassed everything that was talked about previously. Moved by Hoadley and seconded by Christoffersen to sign the comprehensive plan agreement with Southern Iowa Council of Governments. Walker abstained. Approved.

NOT TO EXCEED \$5,000,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION URBAN RENEWAL BONDS: Moved by Walker and seconded by Hoadley to approve Resolution #2025-37 - Resolution Directing the Advertisement for Sale of \$5,000,000 (Dollar Amount Subject To Change) General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds, Series 2025, and Approving Electronic Bidding Procedures and Distribution of the Preliminary Official Statement. Whereas, the Issuer is in need of funds to pay costs of aiding in the planning, undertaking, and carrying out of urban renewal projects under the authority of chapter 403 and Amendment No. 2 to the Adair County Northwest Wind Farm Urban Renewal Plan including the replacement of the grandstand structure and all related demolition and site improvements at the Adair County Fairgrounds, essential county urban renewal purpose project(s), and it is deemed necessary and advisable that the County issue General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds, for such purpose(s) to the amount of not to exceed \$1,500,000 as authorized by Sections 331,443 and 403,12 of the Code of Iowa; and WHEREAS, pursuant to notice published as required by Sections 331.443 and 403.12 this Board has held a public meeting and hearing upon the proposal to institute proceedings for the issuance of said Bonds, and all objections, if any, to such Board action made by any resident or property owner of the County were received and considered by the Board; and no petition having been filed, it is the decision of the Board that additional action be taken for the issuance of said Bonds for such purpose(s), and that such action is considered to be in the best interests of the County and the residents thereof; and WHEREAS, the Issuer is in need of funds to pay costs of aiding in the planning, undertaking, and carrying out of urban renewal projects under the authority of chapter 403 and Amendment No. 2 to the Adair County Northwest Wind Farm Urban Renewal Plan including the N51 Shoulder Widening, bridge replacements, and culvert replacements, essential county urban renewal purpose project(s), and it is deemed necessary and advisable that the County issue General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds, for such purpose(s) to the amount of not to exceed \$5,000,000 as authorized by Sections 331.443 and 403.12 of the Code of Iowa; and WHEREAS, pursuant to notice published as required by Sections 331.443 and 403.12 this Board has held a public meeting and hearing upon the proposal to institute proceedings for the issuance of said Bonds, and all objections, if any, to such Board action made by any resident or property owner of the County were received and considered by the Board; and no petition having been filed, it is the decision of the Board that additional action be taken for the issuance of said Bonds for such purpose(s), and that such action is considered to be in the best interests of the County and the residents thereof; and WHEREAS, in conjunction with its Municipal Advisor, Speer Financial, Inc., the County has caused an Official Statement to be prepared outlining the details of the proposed sale of the Bonds; and WHEREAS, the Board has received information from its Municipal Advisor evaluating and recommending the procedure hereinafter described for electronic, facsimile and internet bidding to maintain the integrity and security of the competitive bidding process and to facilitate the delivery of bids by interested parties; and WHEREAS, the Board deems it in the best interests of the County and the residents thereof to receive bids to purchase such Bonds by means of both sealed and electronic internet communication. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF ADAIR COUNTY, STATE OF IOWA: Section 1. That the receipt of electronic bids by facsimile machine and through the SpeerAuction Competitive Bidding System described in the Notice of Sale and Official Statement are hereby found and determined to provide reasonable security and to maintain the integrity of the competitive bidding process, and to facilitate the delivery of bids by interested parties in connection with the offering at public sale. Section 2. That General Obligation Urban Renewal Bonds. Series 2025, of Adair County, State of Iowa, in the amount of \$5,000,000 (subject to change), to be issued as referred to in the preamble of this Resolution, to be dated August 21, 2025, be offered for sale pursuant to the published advertisement. Section 3. That the preliminary Official Statement in the form presented to this meeting be and the same hereby is approved as to form and deemed final for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission, subject to such revisions, corrections or modifications as the Chairperson and County Auditor, upon the advice of bond counsel and the County's Municipal Advisor, shall determine to be appropriate, and is authorized to be distributed in connection with the offering of the Bonds for sale. Section 4. That the Auditor is hereby directed to publish notice of sale of the Bonds at least once, the last one of which shall be not less than four clear days nor more than twenty days before the date of the sale. Publication shall be made in the "Adair County Free Press and Adair News", a legal newspaper, printed wholly in the English language, published within the county in which the Bonds are to be offered for sale or an adjacent county. ENRIVONMENTAL HEALTH: Kent Irwin, Environmental Health, gave an update to the Board: been doing many water tests, still about 8 weeks out on perc tests and doing them as quickly as possible, discussed well plugging and radon testing. Irwin exited at 9:12 a.m.

CROSSROADS – 24-25 SCHOOL YEAR RECAP: Brittany Palmer, Kate Jensen, and Jessica Petter, Crossroads gave an update to the Board on the 24-25 school year program that is being funded by Adair County Opioid Settlement funds. Jensen stated that all programs were successful and that all students felt they did well on their goals which focus on school achievement/attendance, drug use control, and mood management. They have been looking towards next school year and have reached out to teachers to see if there are any students that may be interested in program and have already met with some of those students. Supervisor Walker asked if there would be a program next year for the fifth graders since they were moving to the middle school next year. At this time there is anything planned with their current time capacity/scheduling conflicts, but it can be something they can discuss and see about eventually bringing on another staff member. The group agreed that having that consistent message and starting earlier is most beneficial to the students. Palmer, Jensen, and Petter exited at 9:22 a.m.

Approved. **Maintenance & Activities Report** – Engineer Kauffman gave an update to the Board on the following projects: Murphy has delivered the beams for the Section 6 Summerset bridge, Govig will be closing the road for the W1 Lee project on riverside next week and have started moving in equipment, Manatts will become to seal the cracks, have signed the final paperwork yesterday for FEMA so am hoping to receive a check in about 3 weeks followed by the local match and administration costs for the Cat Z project later, P38 contractor should start Monday next week – ramps will be closed along with the road between the interstate and Dexter with construction completing in September, Schildbergs has been working up by the rock and reinforcing the road bank, received the CAT compact loaders, discussed getting a cutter or two either this year or next, and grader training will be in the fall.
