## Adair County Residents

If you were affected by the storms on May 21st, specifically if you no longer have a residence or are displaced due to damage, your residential address on your voter registration does not need to change unless you want to make a permanent change. You will, however, need to establish an alternative mailing address and update your registered mailing address with our office.

If you do come in to replace a license or voter registration card, our office mails the new registration card to your RESIDENCE. If there is no house/mail receptacle to deliver this card to, the USPS will return the card to our office and we will make your voting status inactive, even if you have a forwarding address. The USPS cannot forward this item, per lowa State Code. Upon your status going inactive, our state database will produce a residential status confirmation card, which we will then mail out. This mailing is forwardable by the USPS. Once you receive this card, you must fill out and return, verifying your residential address. After our office receives the confirmation, your voting status will be switched back to active.

If your voting status does become inactive due to returned mail, and we do not receive confirmation back, that <u>DOES NOT</u> mean that you will not be able to vote in November. HOWEVER, THERE MAY BE MORE STEPS TO VOTE ON ELECTION DAY SUCH AS PROVIDING PROOF OF RESIDENCE.
